GE HEALTHCARE MAKES FINANCIAL LITERACY MONTH AND CAREER CONNECTIONS FOR TRENTON AND PLAINFIELD YOUTH

Trenton, NJ and Plainfield, NJ – Financial Literacy Month in April 2010 is a time to recognize the importance of establishing and maintaining healthy financial habits.
